GOSPEL LESSON Luke 5:1-11

So it was, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, and saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and were washing *their* nets. Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon’s, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat. When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, “Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch.” But Simon answered and said to Him, “Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net.” And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. So they signaled to *their* partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw *it*, he fell down at Jesus’ knees, saying, “Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!” For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken; and so also *were* James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, “Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men.” So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Lamentations 3:22-32

Through the LORD’S mercies we are not consumed, Because His compassions fail not. *They are* new every morning; Great *is* Your faithfulness. “The LORD *is* my portion,” says my soul, “Therefore I hope in Him!” The LORD *is* good to those who wait for Him, To the soul *who* seeks Him. *It is* good that *one* should hope and wait quietly For the salvation of the LORD. *It is* good for a man to bear The yoke in his youth. Let him sit alone and keep silent, Because *God* has laid *it* on him; Let him put his mouth in the dust—There may yet be hope. Let him give *his* cheek to the one who strikes him, *And* be full of reproach. For the Lord will not cast off forever. Though He causes grief, Yet He will show compassion According to the multitude of His mercies.”

EPISTLE LESSON 1 Peter 3:8-15

Finally, all of *you be* of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, *be* tenderhearted, *be* courteous; not returning evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing. For “He who would love life And see good days, Let him refrain his tongue from evil, And his lips from speaking deceit. Let him turn away from evil and do good; Let him seek peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the LORD *are* on the righteous, And His ears *are open* to their prayers; But the face of the LORD *is* against those who do evil.” And who *is* he who will harm you if you become followers of what is good? But even if you should suffer for righteousness’ sake, *you are* blessed. “And do not be afraid of their threats, nor be troubled.” But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always *be* ready to *give* a defense to everyone who asks
