## Announcements

The first Convention of the Orthodox Lutheran Confessional Conference (OLCC) will be held July 22-23 in Sioux Falls, South Dakota at the Ramada Inn and Suites, Galley #1 Conference room, beginning @ 8:30 AM with Matins Service. Presentations will include: Rev. Diers, Christian Vocation, and Outreach – A Ministry of Love; Rev. Fehr, Sectarianism, and Justification; Rev. Mahan, The Sacrament of Baptism; Rev. Shrader, Jesus and Socialism; and Rev. Sørensen sent a presentation introducing his congregation (Augustanakirken) in Denmark. Pastor Magnus Sørensen will not be able to attend. His presentation will be given on Friday.

Ramada Inn and Suites is located at 1301 West Russell Street in Sioux Falls.

A block of ten rooms have been reserved until mid June. Just ask for the rates for the OLCC Convention. It should be \$72 + tax per room per night. The rooms are reserved for Wednesday and Thursday. Of course, there are many other hotels in the area that would be less costly, but the Ramada has a shuttle to and from the airport which is within about 1-2 miles away and a great indoor water park. There is also Motel 6 close by on the same street, as well as the Kelly Inn, and an Econolodge, Sleep Inn (a Comfort Inn motel chain), all on Russell Street.

cannot come.’ “So that servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house, being angry, said to his servant, ‘Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here *the* poor and *the* maimed and *the* lame and *the* blind.’ “And the servant said, ‘Master, it is done as you commanded, and still there is room.’ “Then the master said to the servant, ‘Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel *them* to come in, that my house may be filled. ‘For I say to you that none of those men who were invited shall taste my supper.’”

#### SERMON TEXT Romans 10:1-15

Brethren, my heart’s desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved. For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God’s righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. For Christ *is* the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. For Moses writes about the righteousness which is of the law, “The man who does those things shall live by them.” But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, “Do not say in your heart, ‘Who will ascend into heaven?’” (that is, to bring Christ down *from above*) or, “Who will descend into the abyss?” (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart” (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the Scripture says, “Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame.” For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him. For “whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved.” How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: “How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace, Who bring glad tidings of good things!”

#### OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Proverbs 9:1-12

Wisdom has built her house, She has hewn out her seven pillars; She has slaughtered her meat, She has mixed her wine, She has also furnished her table. She has sent out her maidens, She cries out from the highest places of the city, “Whoever *is* simple, let him turn in here!” *As for* him who lacks understanding, she says to him, “Come, eat of my bread And drink of the wine I have mixed. Forsake foolishness and live, And go in the way of understanding. “He who corrects a scoffer gets shame for himself, And he who rebukes a wicked *man only* harms himself. Do not correct a scoffer, lest he hate you; Rebuke a wise *man*, and he will love you. Give *instruction* to a wise *man*, and he will be still wiser; Teach a just *man*, and he will increase in learning. “The fear of the LORD *is* the beginning of wisdom, And the knowledge of the Holy One *is* understanding. For by me your days will be multiplied, And years of life will be added to you. If you are wise, you are wise for yourself, And *if* you scoff, you will bear *it* alone.”

#### EPISTLE LESSON 1 John 3:13-18

Do not marvel, my brethren, if the world hates you. We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love the brethren. He who does not love *his* brother abides in death. Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down *our* lives for the brethren. But whoever has this world’s goods, and sees his brother in need, and shuts up his heart from him, how does the love of God abide in him? My little children, let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth.

#### GOSPEL LESSON Luke 14:16-24

Then He said to him, “A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, “and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, ‘Come, for all things are now ready.’ “But they all with one *accord* began to make excuses. The first said to him, ‘I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.’ “And another said, ‘I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused.’ “Still another said, ‘I have married a wife, and therefore I
